#### Student Behaviour:

Sadly, we are starting to experience some unacceptable student behaviour. This has resulted in a number of stand downs and suspensions. Our Senior Leadership Team is saddened by this behaviour because we waste a lot of our time and it also creates a feeling of unrest in our school.

Suspensions were for the following behaviours which we will not tolerate at our school:

- Defiance
- Fighting or threatening behaviour toward other students
- Being under the influence of drugs or /and possession of drugs paraphernalia at school
- Continual disobedience
- Gross Misconduct

Suspensions are for behaviours which our school will not accept which are dangerous to the student, other students or a dangerous example to others. Every case for suspension is based on its own merits and circumstances. Students can be stood down from school for 5 days in one term and 10 days in a year. A stand down means students will remain home for a period of time from 1 day to 5 days. The Senior Leadership Team is responsible for the length and reasons for Stand downs.

Suspensions are the most serious consequence we can hand out as a school. A suspension means that the student and their support people will meet with the Board of Trustees disciplinary committee. This committee, made up of board members, is responsible for the decision about whether students can return to school and whether they will impose conditions (if any) as part of their return to school. When a student is suspended, they risk being excluded from our school which means if they are under the age of 16, they will need to find a new school to attend.

Inappropriate behaviour goes against our values of Manaakitanga, Whanaungatanga and Hirangatanga. We calculate the students we deal with for this kind of anti-social behaviour are only 5% of our school population. This is less than 30 students. We have rules in place and processes to follow when we deal with these types of behaviour to ensure our school is a safe place for all.

Our deans and senior leadership team are spending a lot of time dealing with a lot of drama around unacceptable behaviour and the impact this has on other students and the school. Under the relevant sections of the Education Act, we will be sending students home until we can schedule meetings with parents or caregivers. Attendance will be marked appropriately.




Many incidents have nothing to do with school but are brought into school by students insisting on making trouble. The root cause so often is social media and the inappropriate use of group chats and posts. Often the situation can quickly get out of control and cause drama at school which then goes on to cause problems for a group of students.

Recently I read the advice of a judge who regularly deals with youth, he said ... "We often hear the cry from teenagers ... "What can we do?" "Where can we go?" My answer is... "Go home, mow the lawn, wash the windows, learn to cook, build a raft, get a job, visit the sick, study and after you have finished, read a book." Your community does not owe you recreational facilities and your parents do not owe you fun. The world does not owe you a living, in fact it is you who owes the world something. You owe it your time, your energy and your talents so that no one will be at war, in poverty or sick or lonely again." In other words, grow up, stop being a cry-baby, get out of your dream world and develop a backbone, not a wish bone. Start behaving like a responsible person. You are important and you are needed. It's too late to sit around and wait for somebody to do something someday. Someday is now and that somebody is you."

We want to focus on the positive behaviours of the remainder of our students and focus more on what we would like to see in our school. Thank you to those whanau who support our efforts and assist us to provide a safe environment. Your assistance is most certainly appreciated.


- Click on "make a booking" tab

# SCHOOLAPP

William Colenso College has its own school app which can be downloaded to your apple or android cellphone (device) -

"On your Apple or Android cellphone (device) please search for "School Apps NZ" and install the app with that name. Once installed please open the App and search for "William Colenso College" to get connected.

This will allow the school staff to send out to those who have downloaded the app, alerts about various activities: sports events, homework reminders etc.

Other functions that are available in the app are:

- absentee tab: to advise when your child will be absent from school
- events tab: will give calendar dates for the school year
- contacts tab: able to make contact via phone or email with a staff member
- Notices: the daily school notices that are available to staff and students about events happening that day in school.
