- Whanaungatanga (Belonging) This value is expressed throughout the college by recognising that every individual contributes to the wider school community. The college will provide an environment that supports assistance, nurturing, guidance and direction to all.
- **Hirangatanga (Striving for Excellence) –** This value is expressed in the college through the recognition of the individual giving their very best toward any task or relationship they have. Value will be placed on recognising excellence as being derived from effort, perseverance and performance

FRIENDLY REMINDERS:

Attendance: Students are expected to be punctual and attend school regularly.

Student Safety - The school is responsible for <u>ALL</u> students during the school day and therefore their whereabouts must be known from **8:45am - 3pm**.

Absences - Should be explained by a dated letter, email or text from the caregivers giving the duration of the absence and the reason for the absence or by phoning the school attendance office on the day of the absence. If it is known in advance that a student will be absent for a few days, the school should be notified (please call the attendance office).

- Lateness Students who are late to school must sign in at the student office in Te Whanau Ora. They will have 5 minutes to move into class. Once at school, students have no reason to be late to class, if they are late for any reason, they must produce a note.
- Leaving the School Grounds Students must sign out at the student office in Te Whanau Ora (before leaving school) where a leave pass will be provided. Students must sign back in on their return. Students can produce an appointment card or have a note from a parent / caregiver outlining the time of the appointment.
- **Illness -** Students who feel unwell must report to the student office in Te Whanau Ora. Students need a NOTE from a classroom teacher before going to the Sick Bay. Our staff will assess you and notify parent / caregiver if you are required to be collected from school.

Toilet Pass - A toilet Pass is required if wanting to visit the toilet during class period. **Drugs, Alcohol, Smoking, and Vaping:** WCC is a drug free, alcohol free, smoke free & vape free

CELL PHONES - Year 7-12 students are **NOT** permitted to have / use a cell phone out in ANY classes or teaching spaces eg: Gym, library. Phones are permitted at break times.


STUDENT ID CARDS
