- You must be at the library 15 minutes before the exam starts:
  - 8.45am for the morning exam
  - 12:15pm for the afternoon exam
- These exams follow NCEA rules
- No phones or smart watches in the exam room
- No notes or written material
- You are allowed a drink bottle (clear bottle), and pens (blue/black). Chrome books will be provided for digital exams
- These exams are an opportunity to practice completing these assessments in an exam setting and within the timeframes.


