- Exams are based on the NCEA level of the exam paper not the subject class
- You must be at the Library at least 15 minutes before the Exam starts

These exams follow NCEA exam rules:

- No Phones or smart watches in the exam room
- No notes or written material
- You are allowed a drink bottle (clear bottle), and pens (blue/black). Chrome books will be provided for digital exams
- These exams are an opportunity to practise completing these assessments in an exam setting and within the timeframes and provide a derived grade result.

Derived grades are evidence-based grades that we may award to students when they can't attend an examination at the end of the year, or their performance is impaired.
